



CODE OF CONDUCT

One of the basic elements of education is self-discipline. You learn to control your own mind so that you do the thing you should do, not the thing you want to do!

A high standard of self-discipline is required from all pupils. You are expected to take responsibility for your own actions and to show courtesy and respect to staff, visitors and to one another.

Uniform must be clean and tidy at all times, long hair if shoulder length must be tied back.

Short hair must be kept off the face.

If ears pierced, only studs should be worn. These must be removed for PE or covered.

Pupils from Transition upwards may wear watches. We encourage analogue watches to help teach the time. Smart watches are not encouraged in top juniors, but if worn they must not have the following features:

- * ability to be tracked via GPS
- * take photographs
- * send and receive calls

Any watch that just records health data, like steps, heart rate, etc. will be fine.

No other jewellery should be worn at school due to safety reasons, but if religious items are worn, they should be removed where possible for activities such as PE.

Pupils must not enter classrooms unless directed to do so by a teacher. Always pay careful attention during lessons and do not allow your mind to wander.
